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usually take about 1 ½ hours and will give you the opportunity to check that we have the correct information for your family member, ensuring we are providing them with the right care suited to their needs. We hope to schedule these appointments during March and April, please get in touch if you would like to book yours.

In other news, we are continuing with refurbishments and improvements around the home with the help of Ken, our maintenance person. We are also planning to introduce protected mealtimes from next month, allowing our staff to focus on medication and assisting residents with meals during these times. You can read more about this later in the newsletter and I thank you in advance for your support with this.

We are all looking forward to spring arriving at the home and hope to arrange several trips out for residents using our minibus. The residents enjoy exploring the local area and have mentioned some ideas for these minibus trips, such as a shopping trip to Godalming and visiting a garden centre.

We have had a great start to 2025 at Springkell House Care Home, following a wonderful Christmas shared with our staff, residents and friends of the home.

This was a fantastic opportunity to show what life is like for residents at the home, as well as answer questions from our visitors who were interested in discovering more about our personcentred approach to care.

In December, the team participated in Christmas Jumper Day, arriving at the home in their best Christmas knitwear, all in the spirit of festive fun and to raise money for Save the Children, a very deserving cause. We are delighted to have Penny with us at Springkell House once again.

This year has already seen positive improvements to the home, with new curtains being hung in our lounges and communal areas, which help to create a cozy space for residents to enjoy spending time in. We are also continuing to redecorate bedrooms around the home whenever we are able, ensuring they feel fresh and comfortable for the residents who will occupy them.

Thank you to those who attended our recent relatives meeting in February. For those who couldn't attend, you should have received the meeting minutes via email. During this meeting we discussed upcoming plans for the home as well as all recent home news. We also took the opportunity to share details of the new laundry system being introduced, helping us to reduce missing items with effective labelling. Please speak to a member of our team if you would like more information.

In order to ensure a smooth dining experience for our residents and staff, we have made the decision to introduce protected mealtimes at Springkell House, starting 1st April. We ask that you avoid visiting the home between the hours of 12:30 – 14:00 and 17:00 – 18:30.

This change will allow our staff to give their full attention to residents during medication rounds and mealtimes, providing any support required to residents without other distractions. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation with this new policy, we are always looking for ways we can make daily activities easier for our residents and further improve the care we provide.

We are fortunate to work with some wonderful service providers who visit the home to offer additional wellness support for our residents. Our chiropodist, lan, visits the home every three weeks to work with the residents on their foot health. The residents always enjoy lan's visits and having a chat with him during their sessions.

Many of our residents also look forward to their weekly visit from our fantastic hairdresser, Karen. Having the chance to be pampered and have their hair done, all within the comfort of the home, is something our residents appreciate and helps them to feel their best.







We would also like to share our appreciation for the Community Care Home Matrons, who visit the home every month to support our staff and residents. These visits give the team the opportunity to reflect on any issues and ask for advice, as well as receiving training on key care issues. We have also booked in some additional training sessions with the Community Care Home Matrons over the coming months, which we expect will be very beneficial to the team.

STAFF NEWS

We have seen some changes to the Springkell House team recently and, after a period of transition, we are incredibly proud of the team we are building at the home. In addition to welcoming Penny as our Interim Home Manager, new team member Aneena joined us as a Senior Care Assistant in January. 

This move has brightened Roy's days and enabled the couple to be together in the same home, which has been very positive for them both.
