2024 was a busy year for Windsor Court, we saw a lot of changes at the home which has set us up for a successful and exciting year ahead. One of the biggest projects of last year was the renovation of the second floor of the home. During the summer there was lots of activity on the second floor as the new rooms began to take shape, while our staff went out of their way to ensure there was minimal disruption to our residents' routine.



In the autumn, we saw the finished results of this first phase of refurbishments and were delighted with how the new rooms came together. Bright, clean and welcoming, this is exactly the kind of space we want to create for our residents, somewhere they can feel comfortable and completely at home.





We were excited to share the new rooms with relatives, friends and community members, so in November we hosted a celebratory afternoon tea event. Since the autumn event, we now have seven new rooms completed on the second floor and we are delighted to have welcomed three new residents to the Windsor Court community, who are comfortably settled in to their rooms. We are excited to welcome more residents to Windsor Court this year as this expansion gives us the ability to offer care to even more individuals.

In addition to these renovations, we also carried out improvements to other areas of the home. Our salon was given an upgrade in 2024, creating a bright and welcoming space for residents to enjoy their hairdressing appointments and other pampering treatments. The new and improved salon has already been put to great use.



In 2024 we worked closely with some fantastic local organisations that we are looking forward to continuing to build relationships with this year.

We have enjoyed regular visits from our friends at Talbot Woods Nursery and St Luke's School, some of our residents even had the opportunity to visit the nursery and be shown around by the children. Time spent with the lovely students at the school and nursery have been greatly enjoyed by our residents, everyone feels uplifted after these visits.



Our local library has continued to provide us with some fantastic reading material of all imaginable genres. This has allowed us to keep the home's library well-stocked and residents have been able to make requests if there is something they want to read.

We have greatly appreciated the support of the trusted assessors team at the local hospital, their support with pre-assessments and patient discharges has been invaluable. By working with the trusted assessors we have been able to ensure a much smoother discharge process for residents coming or returning to the home.

As we moved into winter, we were taking extra care to ensure residents of Windsor Court stayed happy and healthy during the colder months. We are always keen to take any precautions we can to protect against infection, particularly during winter when viruses are more prevalent. Our residents received their flu and covid vaccinations for the season and these were also made available to staff at the home.

We had a fantastic festive season at Windsor Court and were very grateful to receive so many gifts of chocolate and treats for the staff and residents. Thank you to everyone who brought in gifts, this was unexpected and very much appreciated.

In the run-up to Christmas, we hosted our mulled wine and mince pies evening at the home, inviting family and friends to join our residents and staff for a festive evening of mince pies, chocolate yule logs and mulled wine. Our residents and visitors all enjoyed taking part in a Christmas sing-along and some even had a dance. The residents really enjoyed seeing their loved ones and celebrating the festive season together at Windsor Court. Thank you to everyone who came along for making this such a lovely evening.



We are looking forward to another great year at Windsor Court, with lots of exciting plans already in place for 2025 to help make sure life for our residents is happy and comfortable.

Over the coming weeks we will be launching a new Al monitoring system in the home, enabling us to more carefully monitor residents' breathing, sleeping patterns and more. This system is also proven to prevent falls and offers many other benefits to resident safety and wellbeing. Our team received extensive training last month on the new system and are enthusiastic to see how it can play a role in the care we provide.

STAFF NEWS

The team at Windsor Court had a busy winter, making sure our residents needs were met and that they were able to enjoy a great festive season at the home.

We welcomed some new staff members towards the end of last year who have been fantastic additions to the Windsor Court team. Bijitha Vettipara and Lucionara Souza have joined us as Care Assistants, and the arrival of Klaudia Kazaniecka has completed our domestic team. Our new team members have settled in well and have been shown the ropes by our existing members of staff.



Later this month we will be holding a staff orientation day at Windsor Court to welcome our new starters, many of our new team members will also be attending the company-wide orientation day run by Beritaz Care in the spring. This event gives new staff across all Beritaz Care homes the opportunity to learn more about the company, our ethos and values. They will hear from senior members of staff, as well as longserving team members and relatives of residents, about their experiences with Beritaz Care.

Meanwhile, all staff at Windsor Court, whether they have just joined the team or have been with us for years, are encouraged to take part in training to develop their skills. We are running ongoing mandatory training to ensure the team are up to date with current best practices within the care industry and as a chance for them to refresh their skills. Last year, we were joined by team members from our sister homes Chestnut Court, Robertson Nursing Home and Ashton Manor, for an interactive dementia training experience. We are always looking for new ways we can further improve our knowledge and in turn, the care we provide to our residents. This experience enabled our staff to better understand the needs of residents with dementia, providing them with a virtual simulation of the struggles faced by someone with dementia when trying to complete everyday tasks.



In March, our staff will be participating in the Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training on Learning Disability and Autism. This training course will help us to ensure that our team have the right skills and knowledge to provide safe, compassionate and informed care to autistic people and people with a learning disability. This training is something staff at Windsor Court have previously found very interesting and we utilise the knowledge learned during these sessions in our everyday practices.

Many of our staff choose to pursue individual qualifications which we are always happy to support in any way we can. Our senior team members, Sandie, Georgina and Ali, are currently working toward their NVQ Level 3 in Health and Social Care. We are proud of their commitment to developing their skills and for the hard work they will be putting in this year to achieve their qualifications.

There are many exciting things to look forward to for our Windsor Court team, from professional growth to personal news. We would like to say a massive congratulations to Jazneet, who is expecting her baby this month. This is such an exciting time for Jazneet and her family, we wish her all the best from her friends at Windsor Court.

We are grateful to have so many wonderful people that make up our Windsor Court team, including staff that have been with the home for many years. In November we celebrated the 10 year anniversary of Marcus Palmer and in March, Anita Jarmolik will also be celebrating 10 years at the home.

RESIDENT ACTIVITIES

After a busy summer spent in the garden and enjoying outdoor activities, we switched up our activities schedule ready for the colder months and in preparation for the festive season.

We ended our seasonal summer activities on a high with our 'beach week', a series of fun seaside themed activities both at the home and at the glorious beaches in our local area. Residents took part in seaside quizzes and memory games, we also themed our reminiscence activities around the beach using sounds and aromas of the sea.

The highlight of the week was a minibus trip to our local beach in Bournemouth, where the residents enjoyed a lovely walk along the pier while taking in all the sights and sounds of the seaside.



As we moved into autumn and winter there were lots of engaging activities happening inside the home, as well as some wonderful entertainers who came to visit the residents.

Animal therapy experiences are extremely beneficial for residents' wellbeing and a visit from animals always brings so much happiness to the home.
