Community Engagement

We strongly believe in engaging with the local community to better the lives of our residents and be part of a community. Our most recent involvements are with Positive Touch and Womens Institute.

Positive Touch was set up in 2012 by parents and staff of Special Care Baby Unit (SCBU) at Royal Surrey County Hospital to support babies and families during their stay and beyond.

Positive touch became part of Royal Surrey County Hospital Charity in 2018. Although they come under the hospital charity number, they are very much still self-sufficient.

Everything they provide (Welcome Packs, Siblings Pack, Discharge Packs, refreshments, Baby books, etc.) to SCBU is funded by donations and the fundraising of their amazing supporters

Little Rays Pre School at Robertson



Little Rays pre-school now visit us every other week with two different groups of children between the ages of 2 to 5 years.

Slow yoga

We have introduced slow yoga, which has been running every two weeks since February and has proved very popular and easy exercise. This starts at 2.30pm if you wish to come and join in. Please see the activity calendar for dat es.

Recycling at Robertson

We introduced tabards a few months ago to do our bit for the environment and reduce plastic waste.

Having noticed that on average we used 160 disposable plastic aprons per week we took action to reduce this unnecessary waste and created new long lasting tabards for the staff to wear.

We've done it again!

We have worked with Surrey County Council and are now recycling food waste such as vegetable peelings, teabags (we use on average 90-100 per day), bread crusts and general household food waste.

We are very proud that instead of all this waste going to a landfill sites it is going to be made into compost.



Ensuring the Right Team

The most challenging part of my job is to recruit and retain staff. Current political uncertainty over Brexit hasn't helped. Also, working with a younger generation born into an instant world with more rights than any other generation is making recruitment and retention even more difficult.

However Beritaz is always looking into more ways to attract and retain the right people.

The pressure on our long serving staff is enormous as they spend time guiding and teaching new recruits. Of course not forget all the training the company puts new staff through. This process takes 6 months, so if they leave within this time scale it is so disappointing. Therefore, it is vital we look at how we can improve and retain staff.

We value all our employees and offer bonus schemes, incentives and a career. Let's hope we can find the magic spell.

Later in the year we are introducing Employees of the Year award whereby 4 team members will be recognised and rewarded for their overall contribution. Residents and relatives will also be invited to nominate and take part in the judging.

Our CQC inspection took place on 22nd February 2019. The day started with two inspectors and one nurse who were at Robertson from 9.15am until 4.30pm.

The inspectors spent the day observing staff and their interaction with residents, being outside bedroom doors and listening. They spoke indepth to residents, relatives, and staff. They also observed our lunch service as well as the medication round.



We also had an Environmental Health inspection of our kitchen, which we are pleased to say we have maintained A rating of 'Very Good'
