

After a fantastic summer season at Chestnut Court we have all been adjusting to the colder weather and making preparations to care for our residents over the winter months. The majority of our residents, as well as our staff, have now received their autumn booster covid vaccine and their flu vaccines. The final few residents who have not yet been vaccinated will receive their vaccines shortly. We are happy to know that our residents have received this extra level of protection in preparation for winter.

We are pleased to be able to openly welcome visitors to the home and look forward to seeing many of you over the upcoming months and the festive period. Please keep in mind that we do ask for visits to be kept to the residents' rooms, rather than communal areas.

Over the summer we were paid a visit by Environmental Health for our regular inspection, we are delighted to say that Chestnut Court has been awarded a 5 star rating. Thank you to all the team who work so hard to ensure high standards are maintained at all times here at Chestnut Court.



We will soon be carrying out our mock inspection, to check operations and standards across the home, and ensure they are being maintained. This will help us prepare for our CQC inspection in the spring and identify any areas of improvement we can look at.

Ongoing renovations are still taking place around the home, many of the residents' bedrooms are being refurbished and new furniture brought in. We are also renovating the bathrooms and replacing the fittings with updated bathroom suites where needed. We continually make improvements to the home to ensure our residents have a comfortable environment and access to any facilities they require. We are fortunate at Chestnut Court to have such a wonderful community surrounding us. Many organisations were kind enough to donate prizes for the tombola at our summer fete, to raise funds for the Alzheimer's Society. We are looking to continue raising funds for this very worthy cause at our future events with the support of local community members and organisations.

Recently we have been delighted to receive some lovely fresh fruit selections, donated by the local Tesco store. These have been enjoyed at our coffee mornings and used for residents' activities. Tesco have a certain amount they are able to donate to local organisations and we are very grateful to have been chosen to receive these donations, it means a lot to the residents and staff.
