Welcome to our final newsletter of 2023. Throughout this year we have built a fantastic team here at Chestnut Court, who strive to deliver the highest level of care possible for our residents. Our committed care team and the staff across all other departments, work hard every day to support our residents' physical and emotional wellbeing. Our residents' comfort and happiness are always our focus and we are very proud of the care we provide.

I, along with the rest of the team, feel it is very important to involve our residents in their care and we take onboard their input about what happens at the home. All through this year we have held monthly resident meetings, which give residents an opportunity to have their say on key home topics, such as ideas for our activities programme, events planning and menu options. We also ask for their suggestions on where they would like to go on our monthly minibus trips.

In addition to these meetings, we also carry out quarterly feedback surveys which are incredibly useful in helping us to improve our services. Feedback from both the meetings and surveys is used to make changes at the home to improve the experience for our residents. Some recent feedback from residents was that they would like to spend more time with animals, so we incorporated more animal experiences into our monthly activities calendar, including regular visits from a therapy dog called Martha.



HOME NEWS

There have been lots of exciting changes happening at Chestnut Court over the last few months. We have been continuing with our ongoing renovation project at the home, the main entrance has been given a makeover with a fresh coat of paint and re-gravelled entryway. The home now looks lovely and welcoming to all visitors as they arrive.



Inside the home we have been painting the skirting boards so they look fresh and clean in preparation for new carpets which will be laid in the communal areas on the home in the coming weeks. We will continue to decorate residents' bedrooms as and when they are in need of an update.

Of course, with all of these improvements to the home we do our best to ensure any works taking place have minimal impact on our residents, we are conscious of their schedule and do everything we can to minimise inconvenience. We have lots more updates to the home planned for the new year, once all the Christmas festivities have passed, we will be sure to keep you updated on our plans for the home in 2024.

At Chestnut Court our main priority is to ensure we are providing quality care for our residents and acting in their best interests, so we do everything we can to make sure standards at the home are maintained to a good level at all times. Part of this involves ensuring we are meeting care quality standards which are checked through regular inspections by independent bodies. We are expecting an inspection from CQC very soon and are doing everything we can to prepare for this. This month we have had a visit from SRG for a pre-inspection where they provide us with feedback on any areas of improvement, based on the same criteria CQC use. We are confident by taking these steps and maintaining ongoing high standards throughout the home, we will continue to receive a good rating in our inspections.

As we are now firmly within the winter season, we are taking extra precautions to protect our residents against the viruses that are more prevalent this time of year. All of our residents have received their winter flu jabs and autumn booster covid vaccinations at the home, we are also encouraging our staff members to ensure they are up to date with their vaccinations.

Throughout this year, as you may already be aware, we have been raising funds for our chosen charity the Alzheimer's Society. At various events such as our summer fete, we have been holding raffle draws and other competitions to raise money for this cause that is very close to our hearts. We are proud to say we have so far raised £371 of our £500 target for the year. We are still very much hoping to meet that target by the end of the year.

Our coffee mornings are held on the last Wednesday of every month, these events are open to friends and relatives, as well as members of our local community. We always look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at these events.



We have been continuing to host our regular relatives meetings, which we find extremely helpful for keeping you all up to date on what is happening at the home and to hear your feedback. Frances from Two Line Training will be attending our next meeting to talk about end of life care and answer any questions you may have about this topic. We hope this will be a useful and informative experience.

We have lots to update you on regarding the Chestnut Court team. From new team members, long service anniversaries and personal news, we have had a lot to celebrate at the home recently.

the last few months getting to know our residents and starting to plan many fun activities that they have really enjoyed taking part in. We have also welcomed a new member of our care team, Sandeep who has joined us as a Care Assistant. She has successfully completed induction training and is settling in well. Dean has also joined us to oversee the maintenance of the home, helping with general repairs and other tasks to keep things running smoothly.

These training sessions ensure our staff are up-to-date on current best practices within the care industry and are continuing to provide the best possible support to our residents.

The team recently completed their fire safety training, another key area of knowledge which we ensure staff are regularly refreshed on. In this session the team practiced fire safety and evacuation procedures, simulating how they would safely remove residents from the home in the event of a fire. Everyone found the training very helpful and feel confident on how to handle an emergency situation.



We are a very close-knit team at Chestnut Court and we do everything we can to provide a warm and enjoyable environment for our staff to work in, which is part of the reason many of our staff choose to stay with us for many years. Two members of our team have celebrated employment anniversaries in recent months, in August Pamela Hopkins our Health Care Assistant celebrated 23 years at Chestnut Court and in October Emma Wilson, our Home Administrator, celebrated her 10 year anniversary at the home.

Thank you both for your continued hard work and commitment to providing great care to our residents.

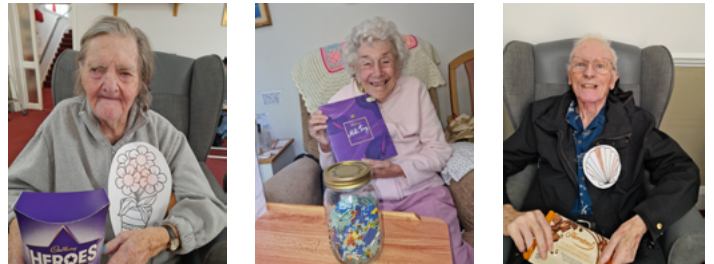

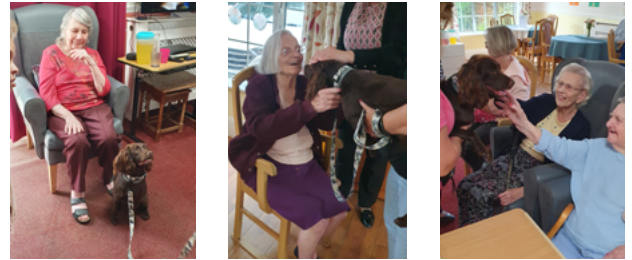
