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## **HOME NEWS**

The new year kicked off to a great start as we moved into 2024 with our newly accredited Home Manager, Ion Gavrila. Ion successfully completed his registration towards the end of last year and the entire team are very happy for him.

We recently carried out both our resident quality survey and staff survey, in order to get feedback on both the service we provide at Springkell House and on how we operate as an employer. We were pleased to have received positive comments overall from both surveys. We have acknowledged feedback from the surveys and have put steps in place to address these points.

We also held our relatives meeting this month, which is another fantastic opportunity to get feedback on the home from our residents' friends and family members, as well as sharing important information and upcoming plans for the home.

The safety of our residents and staff is our number one concern at Springkell House, so we are always keen



to take any steps we can to ensure our home is a safe environment for all. We have upgraded the fire alarm system in the home, including a new control panel and new smoke detectors throughout the building.

This was quite a big job but vital for allowing us to improve fire safety within the home, the new system ensures we are up to date with new fire safety regulations. Our staff also regularly take part in fire safety training to ensure they are well prepared on correct evacuation and safety procedures in case of an emergency.

We are also proud to say the home was awarded a five-star Food Hygiene Rating following an inspection by Waverly Borough Council towards the end of last year. Well done to our chef Jogi and the entire kitchen team who have worked incredibly hard to ensure the highest food hygiene standards are maintained, while delivering tasty and nutritious meals for our residents every day.

We are expecting our regular health and safety inspection to take place soon and will of course keep you updated on any feedback from this. Our lifts are also being inspected soon as part of our general maintenance of the home. All of these tasks contribute to the overall upkeep of the home, enabling us to provide a safe and secure environment for our residents.

Our planned renovations throughout the home are progressing well. The front door and entrance area is looking fantastic after a facelift in the autumn, ready to welcome visitors to Springkell House. Bedrooms throughout the home are in the process of being decorated with several already completed, we are booking in decorating work at times that are likely to cause least disruption to our residents.

We are also in the process of renovating the frequently used communal areas such as our lounges, which should be completed very soon. We are always striving to create a warm and comfortable environment for our residents and visitors, so are regularly making improvements across the home for everyone to enjoy.



## **STAFF NEWS**

We have welcomed several new members to the Springkell House family recently and are so pleased with the strong team we have built this past year. We have welcomed both Robiul and Anemona to our domestic team in recent months, as well as new Care Assistants Pooja and Sita. All our new team members have settled in very well to life at the home and their respective roles.



We are also delighted to welcome Anne-Marie from our sister home Ashton Manor, who has joined us as our Deputy Manager to support Ion in the running of the home. Anne-Marie has been a part of the wider Beritaz Care team for over 10 years and has extensive experience of both the care industry and company practices. At Springkell House we are passionate about supporting all our staff to progress their knowledge and skills, with both independent qualifications and internal training. Several of our staff have recently completed further education qualifications including our Senior Care Assistants. Our staff have also been continuing with regular mandatory training in order to stay up to speed on key skills. In October we held a bowling social event for our staff, which was a lot of fun and got quite competitive. These visits always bring lots of happiness to everyone at the home. The residents really enjoy seeing the animals and having a cuddle.



Another of our residents' favourite things to do is arts and crafts, so we hold regular sessions for them to express their creativity through painting, drawing, collages and other mediums. The residents will often create artwork that is then displayed around the home, or make items they can use or gift to others, like handmade cards and bookmarks. Knitting is another great creative activity that the residents find fun and relaxing, it is also a great way to practice coordination skills and improve dexterity. The residents have all enjoyed working on their own knitting projects recently and we can't wait to see how they look when they are finished.



A popular activity on our schedule is our regular musical entertainment. The fantastic Kevin Jacot comes to the home every week to sing and perform for our residents. As well as being a brilliant singer, Kevin is very funny and takes the time to get to know our residents.



Since joining Springkell House last summer, our Activities Coordinator Cristina has started weekly baking and food related activities with the residents, which has been very popular. The residents have been making lots of delicious snacks recently including filled sweet and savoury pastries. They also baked and decorated their own biscuits. As well as being a fun activity this also provides lots of sensory stimulation with a wide variety of textures, smells and tastes for the residents to experience. They enjoy the process of making the food and having the opportunity to taste lots of different flavours.



In September we hosted our Macmillan Coffee Morning at Springkell House. The residents and our visitors all had a lovely time enjoying some sweet treats and a nice cup of coffee or tea.
