HOME NEWS

It has been a great start to the year at Ashton Manor Nursing Home. We started off 2025 with the great news that the home received a five-star food hygiene rating following a surprise inspection in January. This is another demonstration of the care and attention paid to cleanliness and hygiene by our kitchen staff and every other member of the Ashton Manor team.

The most important opinions are those of our residents and we recently carried out a resident feedback survey. We appreciate the residents sharing their honest thoughts about the home and were delighted to have a really good response. What stood out to us most from the feedback given by the residents is that everyone feels safe within the home, which is really lovely to hear. They commented that the environment is clean and that they are treated with dignity and respect by the staff. They also appreciated the fact that they are able to make their own choices and have control over their lives.

A couple of areas of improvement that were mentioned during this feedback we have already taken steps to action. The lighting within the home came up as an issue for some, which is something that is being improved as part of our current renovations. There were also occasional concerns around the call bell response time during visiting hours at the home. This is an issue we take seriously, we are currently reviewing processes within our staff team to ensure call bell responses are always timely.

The comments from this survey, as well as feedback from staff and family members, have helped to guide some of our recent home improvements. Last autumn, we completed the renovation to our kitchen, upgrading equipment to help our kitchen team provide nutritious meals. During this time our kitchen was out of action, but our wonderful community stepped up to make sure our residents were well-fed. Our sister homes, Springkell House and Robertson Nursing Home, went out of their way to cook some fantastic hot meals for the residents to enjoy. The lovely team from local restaurant The Bengal Lounge also came to the home to serve up a delicious meal, which was such a lovely treat.







As mentioned, we have recently started upgrading the lights throughout the home to a more ecofriendly option. Lights in all the corridors have been swapped out and we are in the process of changing the lights in bedrooms as well as other communal areas. We will also be updating the flooring in the dining room and carrying out some maintenance to our lift. All of these improvements are focused on improving the living and working environment for our residents and staff.

Other improvments also planned for this year include upgrades to various key technologies that are used in the home. We will be updating our call bell system and upgrading our WiFi to improve connection in all areas of the home. A new digital documentation system is being introduced, enabling better management of resident records. These improvements are planned to take place over the summer and should be fully completed by autumn 2025.

We are so appreciative of the wonderful community in our local area, who show so much kindness and support to the residents of Ashton Manor. St Peter's Church and Reverend Jacqueline, Chris Cleland and the Dusty Tracks band, are all wonderful people who give up their time to visit the home to provide support, companionship and entertainment for our residents, we could not be more grateful.

We are lucky to have St Peter's Church next door to the home, which means we are able to arrange weekly visits (weather permitting) to the church for any residents who wish to attend a service. Being able to meet our residents' spiritual needs with the support of our local community is all part of the holistic care we provide at Ashton Manor.







Our Fish & Chips Fridays events were very well-received last year, so we made the decision to continue these into 2025. Taking place every Friday at 2pm, we invite community members aged 65 and over to join us for a delicious fish and chips lunch at Ashton Manor. We can also arrange transportation for anyone having difficulty with travel. If you are interested in coming along or know someone who would like to attend, get in touch to find out more.

The next relatives meeting will be held at Ashton Manor in April. We will be in touch to confirm details and we look forward to seeing many of you there. These meetings are a great opportunity to hear about our upcoming plans for the home, give your input on key issues and ask any questions to our team.
